NEWCASTLE UNIVERSITY BOAT CLUB PRE IV REGATTA

The University of NSW triumphed at the Newcastle University Boat Club Pre IV Regatta at Berry Park last Saturday. Out of 11 races entered, we came away with first places in 7. This was a very good result for our team with some rowers competing in their first regatta EVER!

The day started with the M2x. We had 4 doubles heading up the course to the start line to represent UNSW. Turner and Fairbairn (1st), Soul and Roddick (2nd) in race 1 and Lassenev and Lassenev (2nd), and Liu and Glenn (3rd) in race 2.

The women's doubles consisting of Laura Honson and Alex Green as well as Serina Lyons and Jess Hudson had an eventful row as halfway down the course they met with one UNSW M4+ crew who had capsized mid race and seemed to be bobbing downstream. Sam Law got a nice introduction to coxing during this race.

Another noteworthy event was the W1x. There were two divisions for the single and UNSW had representatives in both races. Jess Hudson raced first and won her race by a margin of 20 seconds. Laura Honson was our rower in the second division and she led from the start, beating NUBC by 110 seconds.

The W4+ was a tough race, with only two boats in the event both crews were neck and neck the whole 1750m. Over the last 250m the UNSW crew consisting of Laura Honson, Amelia Johnstone, Serina Lyons, Alex Green and coxed by Jess Hudson pushed past the Newcastle University Crew to take first place.

We had two mens 8+ crews, the first crew consisting of Roddick, Soul, Liu, Shar, Lassenev, Reid, Andrews, and Todd and coxed by Gowing. The second crew consisted of George, Lassenev, Carter, Glenn, Mulcare, Honson, Fairbairn and Turner coxed by Carlyle. It was a very interesting race with UNSW1 winning by a margin of 8 seconds over NUBC's IV crew. Our second eight came in third after also having a strong row.

The day finished smoothly thanks to Dave and Heidi making sure that the trailer was packed correctly and that everybody helped out. We all headed back to the shed where we unpacked the boats and then went to the HHH's for a well-deserved meal.

The Newcastle University Regatta is always a fun event. It is a chance for crews to come together and race for the start of the rowing season. It is a time when you can check over your race plan and make sure that you are prepared for the Australian University Rowing Championships.
